RECIPE OF THE MONTH



Fresh Strawberry Upside Down Cake

Prep 15 m CooK 50 m Ready In 1 h 20 m

Ingredients

- 2 cups crushed fresh strawberries
- 1 (6 ounce) package strawberry flavored Jell-O(R) mix
- 3 cups miniature marshmallows
 - 1 (18 ounce) package yellow /white cake mix, batter pre pared as directed on the package

Directions

- 1. Preheat an oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).
- 2. Spread crushed strawberries on the bottom of a 9x13 inch baking pan.
- 3. Evenly sprinkle strawberries with the dry gelatin powder, and top with mini marshmallows.
- 4. Prepare the cake mix as directed on the package, and pour on top of the marshmallows.
- 5. Bake in the preheated oven until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean, about 40 to 50 minutes.
- 6. Cool in the pan for 15 minutes.
- 7. Run a knife around the pan to loosen the sides, and turn the cake out onto a serving tray.
- 8. Store cake in the refrigerator.
